The population had increased by 11,200 people since 2011, approximately 8.9%, compared to 7.5% for the South East and 6.6% for England.


Below the age of 20

Ageing Population

The population had aged between the 2011 and 2021 censuses

shown by an increase in the percentage of individuals occupying the older ages, (65 and over)alongside a **slight reduction** in the percentage of **children** (0-19).

The percentage of the population aged **20-64 declined** slightly over the period, from **59.7%** of the population in 2011 to **57.3%** in 2021.

Households with at least one usual resident

There were **56,900** households with at least one usual resident in Eastleigh Borough in 2021. This was an increase of 4723 households since 2011, approximately 9%, higher than the South East (7.1%) and England (6.2%).

Population Density

The borough had become more densely populated, with 1712 people per square kilometre in 2021,

compared to 1571 people per square kilometre in 2011, an increase of 9%
