

**THE BOROUGH OF EASTLEIGH
(CHANDLER'S FORD AND HILTINGBURY)
(AMENDMENT NO 4) ORDER 2019 PART 1**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Eastleigh Borough Council pursuant to arrangements with Hampshire County Council has made the above mentioned Traffic Regulation Order in exercise of the powers of the said County Council under Sections 1, 2, 4 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Act, and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act.

The effect of the Order will be to introduce:

- a) 'No Waiting at Any Time' restrictions in the following roads:
Charnwood Close both sides from Charnwood Crescent southwards for 10 metres; Charnwood Crescent south side from 10 metres north to 10 metres south of its junction with Charnwood Close; Fryern Close north-east side outside No 37 and north-west side from 3 to 4 metres north-east of the south-western kerblines; Ribble Close (spur) west side from 12 to 22 metres north of Ribble Close (spine); Bodycoats Road both sides from Winchester Road to Springhill Road, and from Springhill Road south-eastwards for 5 metres; Springhill Road north-west side from 1 metre north-east of the south-western kerblines of Welles Road southwards for 7 metres and from the boundary of Nos 14 and 15 south-westwards to the boundary of Nos 10 and 11, south east side from 6 metres south-west of Welles Road to a point 6 metres north-east of Welles Road, both sides from Regent Road to 5 metres south of the boundary of Nos 1 and 2; Steele Close south-east side from 4 to 16 metres south of No 1
- b) 'Waiting limited to 2 hours No Return within 3 hours' Monday to Friday 8am to 6pm in Bournemouth Road, south-east side for the entire length of the layby across the frontage of 13 to 17 Bournemouth Road

The Order will come into operation on 24 May 2019.

Decisions on whether to introduce the proposed waiting restrictions on Meon Crescent, Ford Avenue, Brook Close and Tangmere Rise have been deferred.

Any persons wishing to question the validity of this Order or any provisions contained in it on the grounds that any requirement of the Act, or any instrument made under that Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may within six weeks from 17 May 2019 apply to the High Court for this purpose.
